# THE SHERMAN LIBRARY Annual Report July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023

#### Dear Friends,

I am pleased to be back at the Sherman Library, supported by a wonderful staff and a dedicated Board of Trustees and surrounded by vibrant community members. This was a year of changes as I stepped back into the role of executive director. The library welcomed a new staff member, Derek Pearson, as one of our very important technical services assistants, and greeted a new group of energetic pages. In addition, we wished our industrious board president, Mariya Hurwitz well as she departed from the position and we embraced Barbara Ireland as the new board president.

This year we were able to return to all of our regular pre-pandemic fundraising events in person. The community was thrilled to attend the Annual Gala, Women's Soiree, Annual Golf Tournament, Book Sale, and more. Fundraising is an ongoing effort and is critical to the continued vitality of our library. The funds raised through these events go directly towards operating costs for the library so that we can continue to provide our community with library materials, electronic resources, and great programming for adults and children. Being able to gather in person not only helps to support the library financially but also helps to keep us connected as community members.

This past spring the audio visual system in the program room was upgraded and streamlined. These improvements directly impacted the functionality of the program room and the quality of the presentations offered at the library. In addition, the library acquired an Owl Labs meeting camera to enable remote and hybrid meetings and programs. The Owl camera is portable and can be used in any room of the library. We currently offer in-person programs, remote programs, and select hybrid programs through the Owl.

Adult and children's programs were expanded during the fiscal year to include regularly scheduled and special programs. These programs featured topics in the areas of arts, culture, nature, literature, historic events, science, technology and more. Community members are kept up-to-date on our wide array of programs through our wonderful website, weekly e-newsletters, a weekly events column found in our local papers, and via signage throughout the library. As always, our programs are free for our patrons to attend.

As we reflect on the 2022-23 fiscal year with much of the pandemic behind us, we are very thankful for the generosity and continued support of our members, volunteers, and patrons. The dedicated Sherman Library staff and Board of Trustees have guided the library through these past difficult few years and are ever vigilant as we return to normalcy.

The Sherman Library is the heart of our community, a place where people of all ages can expand their knowledge through a varied selection of books and library materials, partake in interesting programs, and access digital offerings. It is a special space where patrons feel comfortable to explore, gain knowledge, collaborate, and gather. We look forward to another year of community engagement and to expanding library offerings to the patrons of Sherman.
